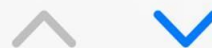

The session was good. I wasn't able to get on to the QR code with the five questions to answer, I'm using a new iPad and something happened, my apologies.

On one of the subjects that we touched on, adequate consultation within the communities, how does CR know that the companies have consulted with the communities? I am president of the Metis Society here and have been for 22 years; we have had several pipelines in our town and around us and we have not been consulted once - that is a fact. I don't know if I should submit something into the crown consultation team, but a consistent approach in areas of importance like this for the communities is important.

The filing manual is a good tool to be using. I also believe that the language used through the government workers could be a little more clear for the community leaders, so there are no barriers between them and understanding. I also believe that the update on the general information should be done often, not knowing how many times you upgraded on the Indigenous side, land-users should be made aware of any projects that are in their area.

At the end, project reviews are always excellent along with the rules. I realize some of these rules are not current and am wondering if there are time limits also to be upgraded before the completion of a project.
